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## CFID Safe Drinking Water Pilot Project Grant 2016

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The **CFID Safe Drinking Water Pilot Project Grant** was established for the promotion of studies investigating one of Canada's most valuable resources, water. Notably, one in eight people around the world do not have access to safe drinking water leading to significant global morbidity and mortality. This grant was created as seed funding to promote research in this field. One grant of \$10,000 will be conferred.

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### Applicants Must:

- Currently hold a Faculty position at a Canadian Post-Secondary Institution; and
- Submit a summary of research achievements by two years after receipt of the grant.

Preference will be given to members of AMMI Canada working in Medical Microbiology or Infectious Diseases.

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Applications with supporting documentation should be sent by e-mail as a PDF document to [susan.richardson@sickkids.ca](mailto:susan.richardson@sickkids.ca) and must be received no later than January 22, 2016.

Submissions will be reviewed by the CFID Awards Committee and the winner will be announced February 26, 2016. The grant will be conferred at the AMMI Canada – CACMID Annual Conference in Vancouver, BC.

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### Applications must include:

- The principal investigator's academic position, institution, professional address, phone, and e-mail address;
  - The project proposal (maximum of 5 pages, 12pt font and 1" margins) including:
    - Background / Rationale;
    - Hypothesis;
    - Research Plan / Methods; and
    - Significance/Impact/Relevance;
  - A budget (as this is an operating grant, funds cannot be used to pay stipends or salaries);
  - Curriculum vitae of principal/co-investigators (maximum 3 pages); and
  - Appendices (not required):
    - Relevant manuscripts (3 maximum);
    - Timeline: To be completed within 2 years; and
    - Letters of support (3 maximum).
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
