### CFID Safe Drinking Water Project Grant 2018

The **CFID Safe Drinking Water Project Grant** was established for the promotion of studies investigating one of Canada's most valuable resources, water. Notably, one in eight people around the world do not have access to safe drinking water leading to significant global morbidity and mortality. This grant was created as seed funding to promote research in this field. One grant of \$25,000 will be conferred.

#### Applicants Must:

- Currently hold a faculty position at a Canadian post-secondary institution; and
  - Submit a summary of research achievements by one year after receipt of the grant.

Applications with supporting documentation should be sent by e-mail as a **single** PDF document to [Coleman.Rotstein@uhn.ca](mailto:Coleman.Rotstein@uhn.ca) and must be received no later than January 29, 2018.

Submissions will be reviewed by the CFID Awards Committee and the winner will be announced February 26, 2018. The grant will be conferred at the AMMI Canada – CACMID Annual Conference in Vancouver, BC (May 2-5, 2018).

#### Applications must include:

- The principal investigator's academic position, institution, professional address, phone, and e-mail address;
  - The project proposal (maximum of 5 pages, 12pt font and 1" margins) including:
    - Background / Rationale;
    - Hypothesis;
    - Research Plan / Methods; and
    - Significance/Impact/Relevance;
  - A budget
  - Curriculum vitae of principal/co-investigators (maximum 3 pages); and
  - Appendices (not required):
    - Relevant manuscripts (3 maximum);
    - Letters of support (3 maximum).
  - Timeline: To be completed within one year;
